Providing trauma treatment support services specifically for Aboriginal women and men who have been impacted by crime. Ki-da-do-dun-kay-go means "You can do something" in the Ojibway language.

Employment Opportunity:

Eyaa-keen Centre, Inc. is a non-profit organization that is run by a volunteer Aboriginal Board of Directors for the purpose of providing Traditional based psychological rehabilitative programs and services that focus on the spiritual, mental, emotional and physical well-being of Aboriginal people.

The "Being Me, Being Free" training sessions at Eyaa-keen address a variety of issues including needs of survivors of the Residential Schools Legacy, victims of historical trauma, abuse, domestic violence, and other traumas and losses. This program is internationally accredited. The Centre also provides an Elders Support Program.

BEHAVIOURAL HEALTH SPECIALIST (BHS) with Traditional Background

(Term/Full time)

Eyaa-Keen Centre Inc. is seeking a mature and independent individual with demonstrated skills in assessment and treatment. The individual will be of Aboriginal descent with a strong interest and commitment to working in the healing and wellness field. This position involves being trained and mentored in an innovative Behavioural Health Treatment program.

Responsibilities include providing one to one treatment sessions to Aboriginal adults affected by trauma and major loss. The focus is on supporting the individual through their treatment plan. Candidate will be learning and following a system of intake and reporting, compiling statistics, and other general administrative duties.

This is a specialized position - candidates should be aware of and be sensitive to the unique needs of those impacted by crime.

Reporting to the Lead Behavioural Health Specialists, the successful candidate must:

- Have 3 to 5 years of counselling/treatment experience working one to one with adults
- Be willing to participate in and apply the in-house intensive Traditional-based disciplines training (compulsory)

- Know safety and how to teach it
- Know when a client is in crisis.
